About the Christ Candle

We continue to burn the Christ Candle from Christmas through Pentecost (except Good Friday) to recognize the light of Christ in the world connecting Christmas to Pentecost. After Pentecost, the Christ Candle will return as part of the Advent wreath.

About Today's Readings

We print the scripture readings in the bulletin so you can follow along more easily. We also include the page numbers if you want to read from your pew Bible. Most of the time our readings are from The New Revised Standard Version translation, the same as your pew Bible. Exceptions are noted.

Acts 3:12-19

Today's reading from church history quotes a sermon from the Apostle Peter delivered from "Solomon's Portico" on the east side of the "new" old temple. From this vantage point, Peter would easily have the Mount of Olives and the Garden of Gethsemane in his sightline, just over the eastern wall of what is now the "old city"—the scene of Jesus' arrest, where he was present. It's hard to imagine the scene not flashing through his mind as he preaches about Jesus' connection to the Patriarchs of Judaism and Moses.

1 John 3:1-7

The authorship of the three letters of John in the New Testament is often attributed to the "John" of the Gospels, though there's little proof to actually connect them. Even so, these letters share the "Johannine" spirit.

Luke 24:36b-48

During the Lectionary Year "B" which focuses on Mark's Gospel, we have to lean on the other Gospels for post-Easter Jesus stories. Mark's Gospel technically ends at the empty tomb. So, what follows Mark 16:8, "The Longer Ending of Mark," is considered a redaction added later by scholars or translators. Today's Gospel story is one of the resurrection appearance stories.

About the Affirmation of Faith

The later disproved legend was that the Apostles, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, wrote this creed on the tenth day after the Ascension. It originated in Rome ca. 100 and became the common creed of Western Christendom when it took its present form ca. 700. Often used at baptism, the three articles were put to the candidate in the form of a question: "Do you believe?" After each affirmative answer, the candidate was immersed. Note that this bare-bones creed does not mention the ministry or teachings of Jesus. It's just the "facts." (Research by Charles Courtney)

2018 Per Capita

Each year congregations in our Presbytery pay a per member fee that provides support for Newton Presbytery (Morris, Sussex, Warren and portions of Hunterdon and Passaic counties), the Synod of the Northeast (New Jersey, New York and all of New England), and the General Assembly.

We ask all those who are able to consider covering your 2018 per capita fee of \$35 per member. This includes youth who have been confirmed. For example, for a couple the per capita amount is \$70. For a family with one youth who is also a member, the per capita is \$105.

Paying your per capita allows us to allocate all of your pledges and offerings to the operations and missions of this church. When paying your fee please note "per capita" on your check or envelope.
