### Reading from Early Church History

Acts 11:1-18

(N.T. pg. 130)

<sup>1</sup>Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. <sup>2</sup>So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, <sup>3</sup>saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" <sup>4</sup>Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, <sup>5</sup>"I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. <sup>6</sup>As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. <sup>7</sup>I also heard a voice

saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' <sup>8</sup>But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' <sup>9</sup>But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' <sup>10</sup>This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. <sup>11</sup>At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. <sup>12</sup>The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. <sup>13</sup>He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; <sup>14</sup>he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' <sup>15</sup>And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup>And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' <sup>17</sup>If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" <sup>18</sup>When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

What gifts do you bring? Share with us! Joyful worship comes from the soul of our collective Spirit. Come find your voice or vision here! Come play, sing, ring bells, read, lead, serve communion. If you have a gift of the arts such as music, drama, dance, poetry, prose, painting, or sculpting for examples, please give some thought to sharing it in worship. What a great blessing!

### About Today's Worship

We are developing a more blended style of worship with new contemporary worship songs and music as well as our traditional hymns and pieces. All of our hymns are from the new Presbyterian hymnal *Glory to God* printed for you in the bulletin. The choir sings. We have organ music. The bell choir rings. We hear our students. We hear soloists. We hear the band. It's a mix, and we don't have everything in the same day—unless you want to skip lunch. We hope it touches you.

### About Eastertide

Easter is the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ, signaling the end of the fasting season of Lent. We celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ as the hope and stay of the world throughout the entire season of Eastertide which falls between Easter and the Pentecost.

Easter in the Western Church falls in the calendar on the Sunday following the first full moon after the Vernal Equinox (the beginning of Spring).

### About the Christ Candle

We continue to burn the Christ Candle from Christmas through Eastertide (except Good Friday) to recognize the

light of Christ in the world connecting Christmas through Pentecost. The Christ Candle goes away on the Pentecost (the birth of the Church) and returns again in Advent.

### **About Today's Readings**

We print the scripture readings in the bulletin, so you can follow along more easily. We also include the page numbers if you want to read from your pew Bible. Most Sundays, our readings are from that same New Revised Standard Version translation. Exceptions are noted.

### **About Acts 11:1-18**

There was great debate among the early believers about whether a Jesus follower had to first be Jewish and then convert to "The Way." Today Peter lays out The Way for all people, Jews and Gentiles alike, and for us, too.

### **About John 13:31-35**

Today's Gospel scripture is known as the beginning of the "Farewell Discourse." Jesus is giving final instructions to the disciples about how to abide in the Spirit and build community. Today we receive a "new commandment."

### **About Revelation 21:1-6**

Revelation is literally another word for apocalypse, that is an "unveiling or unfolding" of things not already known or that couldn't be known if not for the revelation. Prophetic and typically about end times, apocalyptic literature is a genre that developed during post-exilic Judaism and early Christianity to address in part the expected renewal from the long-awaited return of Jesus.

### **About the Affirmation of Faith**

Most of the time we mine the depths of our Book of Confessions for affirmations of faith including the traditional Apostles' Creed. All of the confessions are based on scripture and they build on the reformed tradition as the church changes and morphs through the ages. Sometimes a

reading straight out of scripture speaks in direct affirmation of our faith in Jesus Christ. Today is one of those days.
