(N.T. pg. 85)

⁵When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, 6"As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down."

They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" «And he said, "Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them.

"When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." 10Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.

Young People's Message

Genesis 22:1-14 (O.T. pg. 17) Reading from the Torah After these things God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 2 He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you." 3 So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him. 4 On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. 5 Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you." 6 Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac. and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. 7 Isaac said to his father Abraham, "Father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "The fire and the wood are here, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" « Abraham said, "God himself will provide the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So the two of them walked on together.

⁹ When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. ¹⁰ Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son. ¹¹ But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven, and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." ¹² He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." ¹³ And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. ¹⁴ So Abraham called that place "The Lord will provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the Lord it shall be provided."

About Today's Readings

We print the scripture readings in the bulletin, so you can follow along more easily. We also include the page numbers if you want to read from your pew Bible. Most Sundays, our readings are from that same New Revised Standard Version translation. Exceptions are noted.

About Genesis 22:1-14

Abraham's sacrifice of Isaac is one of the best-known and most beloved stories from the Torah, the book of law of Judaism. Reading through the Old Testament, we learn that God makes use of some pretty despicable characters—even the "father" of Judaism, Christianity, and Islam.

About Luke 21:5-19

Today's Gospel lesson was likely written after the fall of the temple. Drastic change is coming and Jesus warns them of the high price of discipleship. He cautions about false prophets who prey on gullible people. The good news of the Gospel is the abundance of spiritual resources to cope with hardship and adversity.

About the Affirmation of Faith:

This week's Affirmation of Faith is from a document that is not a part of our constitutional Book of Confessions. The declaration was adopted in 1977 by the Presbyterian Church in the United States. In 1985, the 197th General Assembly of the very new Presbyterian Church (USA) adopted this declaration as a contemporary statement of faith, a reliable aid for Christian study, liturgy, and inspiration—though it was never entered into our polity.

CHRIST'S RETURN AND JUDGMENT



This hymn develops the imagery of Jesus' remark (Matthew 7:24–27/ Luke 6:47–49) that those who believe in him and act on that belief are like someone who builds a house on a rock. The text is set to a tune created for it by a prolific 19th-century American composer and editor.
